MEET OUR CAST AND CREW

Sarah Sneesby (Script Adaptation, Director & Movement Direction)

Sarah has an MFA in Movement: Directing and Teaching from The Royal Central School of Speech and Drama, and is the founder and executive artistic director of Creative Movement Practices. She is a mixture of many emotions as she prepares the cast and crew for this journey through storytelling in her first book adaptation for the stage. Her first foray to creating a story from scratch was co-writing her theater troupe's children show senior year of high school, where she co-wrote, co-directed, and choreographed "A Tale for Two...and then Some". In college she was introduced to the journey of physical theatre and creating a story entirely founded in movement. Since then she has directed, movement directed, and choreographed many original premiere and adaptation projects both here in Houston (Liberators, an American Musical; Dracula; PRESTO Fairy Tales) and in London (LEGS, Plaza), and has worked as an adjunct faculty member and a guest instructor both here in Houston and in New York. Her skill with the sword and desire to find the comic bits within fight choreography for our All Ages production is just one of the many reasons Sarah approached her with this project. One of Sarah's favorite things about working with many high school theatre departments around Houston is watching the next generation of talent go off to college or university and sometimes, if we are lucky enough, see them come back to this city and work professionally in their hometown! Jade is a stage manager and designer. They have studied Technical Production and Design as well as Dance at University of Houston, and Sam Houston State University. They began their

professional career as a company member in Weathervane Theatre's season 54 in New Hampshire, serving as their master electrician and assistant lighting designer. Since then, they have worked within Houston's educational communities as a teaching artist with Brave Little Company, by introducing students to basics of theatre, technical theatre, and movement.
